







The Great Wall of China is one of the extraordinary wonders of the world.

It is the world's longest outdoor museum, stretching from Jiayaguan in the west to Shanhaiguan on the eastern seaboard.




This tour will explore the diverse history of the Great Wall, as well as current efforts to preserve the monument.
