The Children's Museum and....




Alabama's Constitution Village are also part of Early Works and are all within easy walking distance of one another. Together they form a significant portion of the downtown walking tour.



The Huntsville Museum of Art is also downtown and is located in Big Spring International Park. Nearby all the other downtown features is one of the oldest neighborhoods--



the Twickenham Historic District--and it rounds out the walking tour.




One of Huntsville's loveliest attractions is its botanical garden. It has many sections of native and aquatic plants and one of the largest seasonal butterfly houses in the nation. The gardens are located near the Space Center, which completes another portion of the Huntsville tour.



The city has something for the naturalist or outdoorsman also. Overlooking the city on top of Monte Sano, a state park with all the trimmings awaits the visitor.



After exploring the park's many features, the trip back down can include a stop at Burritt on the Mountain, which is a living history museum and mansion of Doctor William Henry Burritt.



The grounds include several outbuildings, which represent a farm of the 19th century.

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
