Nyack is a great town in which to rent a bike, ride along the San Francisco-like hills and take in the river views. Strolls along the Hudson River will reveal Victorian houses with "widow peaks" rising above the trees.



If your feet can take it, you can walk from the river up to the busiest street. There, hardwood-floor bars and foreign cuisine restaurants will tempt your taste buds with a delightful *mélange* of ethnic flavors and comfort foods.



If you are on Main Street on the weekends, the live music at Casa Del Sol will send festive rhythms out the door and into your soul, tempting you to dance on the sidewalks!
