
Heidelberg is magical. It is noted for its charming riverside setting, its romanticism, and its history, dating back to before the founding of its university in 1386.



On the nearby mountainside, the red sandstone Heidelberg Castle is the mighty centerpiece above Old Town.




The castle took 400 years to build, incorporating many styles of architecture, from Gothic to Renaissance.



The castle gardens, commissioned by young Emperor Friedrich V, were once considered the Eighth Wonder of the World.




In Old Town the towering Holy Spirit Church is the visual landmark within the Marktplatz.

rather students in the 1700s and 1800s who, during confinement, adorned the walls with paintings and graffiti.



The Neckar River cuts through the city allowing for boating and riverside walkways and parks.



A walk east along the Neckar leads to the Old Bridge with its picturesque Baroque towers.
