

Strolling through the streets is a great way to get a feel for this city, as most of its main museums and sights are located within a five-kilometer radius.



This tour will take you on a walk through some of Madrid's most beautiful and prominent buildings. We'll pass through world-class museums like the Prado and the Reina Sofia, home to works by Grand Masters like Pablo Picasso, Salvador Dali and Goya. And you'll also get some tips on when to visit for free, or at a reduced price.



We'll explore palaces like the Palacio Réal and the Crystal Palace. We'll also be viewing impressive structures like the Catedrál de la Almudena and the Atocha, a railway station that's home to a mini tropical jungle!
