Munich is a beautiful city with a horrifying past. This was the birthplace of the Nazi party and the home of its headquarters.



Hitler called Munich "*Die Hauptstadt der Bewegung*" or the Capital of the Movement. Allied Supreme Commander General Eisenhower called it "The Cradle of the Nazi Beast." This tour tells us why.



Behind the beautiful façade, many of Munich's buildings carry secrets of the city's dark past. You'll see where Hitler made his first major speeches and where he gave the

orders for the Kristallnacht, the first grave milestone to the Holocaust.



You'll visit the beer hall where he formed the Nazi party...



and the building that used to be the
dreaded Gestapo headquarters.



You'll see where Hitler attempted to shoot his way to power...



and you'll see some of the memorials that have been built to pay homage to the many victims who lost their lives during the Holocaust.



You'll see what's left of the Nazi Honour Temples and the parade grounds that formed the ideological heart of the Nazi Party.



You'll also hear a number of stories on this tour. You'll hear about the events that led up to the Kristallnacht and all about the failed Beer Hall Putsch when Hitler could have been stopped 10 years before he became a dictator. You'll also hear some amazing stories of the German Resistance Movement.



You'll hear how ordinary Germans risked their lives by dodging certain Nazi memorials and you'll hear about the White Rose Revolution.



The biggest irony is that while most of Munich was bombed and brought to rubble, many Nazi buildings survived and still stand today. Join in as we take a walk through some of the darkest moments in history and understand the events that shaped and eventually led to the Holocaust.

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
