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
Tour Summary

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A Day in Tokyo






Start with a tranquil traditional garden. The Japanese proudly say they have four distinct seasons and the garden is planted to look good any time. I was there in autumn.

....and admire the way even the smallest construction is designed to look good as well as be functional..




Visit the Tokyo/Edo museum, packed with detailed models like this roofscape--yes, it really is a scale model!



Drop in at the Sumo Wrestling Museum in the forecourt of the Stadium ...




...then take the boat downriver, traveling under a series of gaily painted bridges.




You'll pass modern offices, traditional buildings and lots of river traffic.
