...surround the main plaza - the founding site of what is now New Mexico's largest city.



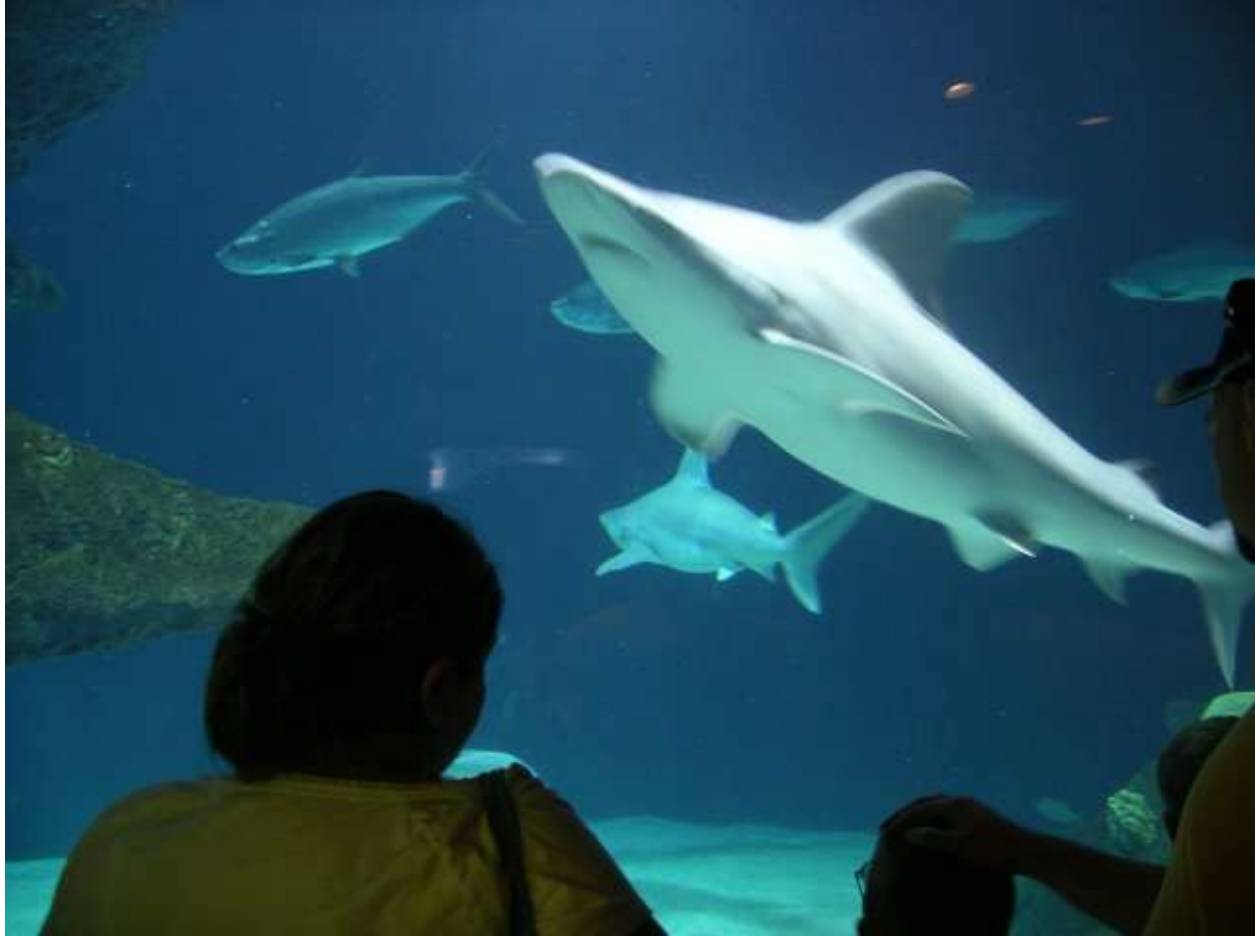
Just beyond Old Town to the northeast are three museums, each a half-day's entertainment in themselves...
