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Navigating the Giza Pyramids & the Sphinx





Hi, I'm Hany Halim, your tour guide. You are going to see the greatest achievement by human beings, the great pyramids and the Sphinx.



Let me tell you how to navigate around the site and give you a glimpse of the treasures you will see before we actually discuss them in detail.

The tour begins as you pass the gate and you find yourself in front of the north side of the great pyramid...



You'll walk along that side to the northeast corner, then turn right.



By turning right here you will see the two boat pits on your left side and the three queens' pyramids as well.



At the end of this side, you'll turn right again to go to the boat museum.



You'll find the boat museum on your left side. You can then walk to the end of this side to reach the southwest corner.



Crossing the road puts you directly in front of the Khafra pyramid.



You can then visit the inside of it, if you like.



You'll go on the paved road to reach the Menkaure pyramid.



And continue up the paved road to the plateau where you will enjoy the wonderful western panorama of the Giza pyramids.



Going down along the paved road you will find the Sphinx on your right side.



When you turn to face it, from the east side, you will see this wonderful view.

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
